Types of Hazard

This chart divides workplace hazards into broad categories, then gives examples of each. Organisations can use the chart to help identify the hazards specific to a particular site or event. The chart has been adapted by the Environment Network Manawatu from a NZ Landcare Trust list. It is not meant to be exhaustive, but merely to give examples in each of the categories.
